Notice is given under Section 43 of the Crown Pastoral Land Act 1998 by the Commissioner of Crown Lands that he has put a Preliminary Proposal for tenure review to Peter Richard Dunbier and Jennifer Lesley Dunbier, Jessess of Obeliak Crock Pastoral Lease.

General description of proposal:

- 129.95 ha (approximately) to be designated as land to be restored to Crown control under Section 35 (2) (b) (i) Crown Pastoral Land Act 1998.
- (2) The above designation is to be subject to a grazing concession to P R & J L Dunbier under Section 36 (1) (a) Crown Pastoral Land Act 1998 for a term of 5 years.
- 400.1882 ha (approximately) to be disposed of by freehold disposal to P R & J L Dunbier under Section 35 (3) Crown Pastoral Land Act 1998.

 Land to be designated to be restored to Crown control as a conservation area (under Section 35 (2) (b) (i) of the Crown Pastoral Land Act 1998).

2.1.1 Grazing concession under Section 36 (1) (a) Crown Pastoral Land Act 1998:

Area: 129.95 ha (cross-hatched pink on the plan attached as Appendix

The concession is for a term of 5 years with no right of renewal and allows grazing for up to 400 two-tooth ewes for a period of 6 weeks during February to April.

2.2 Land to be designated as land to be disposed of by freehold disposal to P R & J L Dunbler (under Section 35 (3) Crown Pastoral Land Act 1998).

Area: 400.1882 ha (approximately) (shown edged green on the plan attached as Appendix I).

(3) Description of Proposed Designations:

3.1 Proposed conservation land:

Area: 129.95 ha (approximately) (edged pink and cross-hatched pink on the map attached as Appendix I).

This area is the upper portion of the current Obelisk Creek Pastoral Lease. The lower boundary ranges in altitude from 1200 – 1300 m.a.s.l. and the proposed conservation land extends to the crest of the Old Man Range at an altitude of approximately 1640 metres.

The area comprises a small part of the extensive RAP OM 1/7 Oheliak - Old Man Range, and includes part of the cryoplaned surraint plateau landform with periglacial features, with cushionfled, herbifield and tassock lands. It comprises the headwaters of the Coal Creek catchment, and adjoins extensive conservation land holdings (primerly Eurosciengh Station) on the range.

Details:

Landscape - The proposal forms part of the Old Man Crest - Dome Landscape Management Zone. The variety of landscape features and characteristics, and the vulnerability of these features are key elements in the landscape character of the range.

Landform and Geology - The proposal includes a small part of the cryoplaned enumer plateau with active and relicit perighacial features such as marmons rock tors, prominent solithacion terraces; lag surfaces, soil hummocks and stripes. These geophysical features are of scientific importance and are ranked as High in the landform description of the RAP. They comprise the most spectacular variety of scriptical landforms in the ecological district.

Vegetation - The majority of the proposal is contained within the RAP. Vegetation communities consist of cushionfield, patterned ground, herbireld and tall tussock lands and are all intact through the full altitudinal range. The RAP is ranked high for its diversity especially of the alpine plant communities, naturalness and visibility.

Fauna — Summit high-alpine cushionfield and herbfield communities characteristically have a rich invertebrate fauna. The fauna of the proposal is representative of such areas of the Old Man Range. A new species of stone fly was discovered associated with C. macra tussock lands. A quatate invertebrate fauna of the Cool Creek tributaries is rich and typical of the Old Man Range. The uplands of the range are an important habitat for New Zealand falcon and the occasional Nea. Both are Calegory B species for conservation.

Historic - Part of the historic (1870's) Doctor Hydes water race is located within the proposal. The race is in good condition and is typical of a high altitude race system in Central Otago.

Recreation - Alpine area is readily accessible from the nearby Symes Road, which is a major recreational access to the Old Man Range. The range popular for cross country sking on land above 1000 metres. A formed wehicle track along the back boundary is heavily used by 4WD enthusiasts in summer. The proposal is an integral part of the recreational alpine setting and is suitable for a range of back country pursuits.

This designation is subject to a short term grazing concession to enable current holders to adjust their grazing management.

3.2 Land to be disposed of by freehold disposal to PR and JL Dunbier:

Area: 400.1882 ha (approximately) (shown edged green on the plan attached as 4ppendix 1. This area comprises all of the area of Obelisk Creek Pastoral Lease below the 1220 – 1300 metre level. The area proposed for freehold disposal is subdivided this oxis blocks and is comprised of 200 ha oversown and hapdressed tussock with a further 200 ha being native feacue and snowgrass leads.

(4) Discussion of proposed designations in relation to the objects of Part 2 CPL Act:

4.1 Objects:

The objects of Part 2 of the CPL Act are set out in Section 24 Crown Pastoral Land Act 1998:

24. Objects of Part 2 - The objects of this part are:

- (a) To:
 - (i) Promote the management of reviewable land in a way that is ecologically sustainable:
 - (ii) Subject to subparagraph (i), enable reviewable land capable of economic use to be freed from the management constraints (direct and indirect) resulting from its tenure under reviewable instrument and
- (b) To enable the protection of significant inherent values of reviewable land -
 - (i) By the creation of protective mechanisms; or (preferably)
 - By the restoration of land to full Crown ownership and control;
 and
- (c) Subject to paragraphs (a) and (b), to make easier -
 - The securing of public access to and enjoyment of reviewable land; and
 - (ii) The freehold disposal of reviewable land.

4.2 Instification and discussion of proposal:

The proposed designations include the restoration of land above 1220 metres to full Crown ownership and control as conservation land, with disposal of the lower country under freehold tenure to the current lessees.

It is considered that this proposal fulfils the objects contained within Section 24 of Part II of the Cown Pastrol I and Act. Ecological sustainability is achieved under both designations. The upper section which contains tall tussock grading into fulfilliest it higher altitudes, will be managed by the Department of Conservation under a no domestic stock grazing regime, with the aim of promoting the protection of significant inherent values as outlined in Section 3.1 of this report. Public access will be ensured from State Highway 8 at Partitudas via Symos Rond and then across the top of the Old Man Range via existing conservation land, formerly part of Earnscleugh Pastron Lease. The land proposed for designation as conservation area has wider significance in that it adjoins a large tract of existing conservation land on the top of the Old Man Range.

Fresholding of the lower land to the curront lessees, will enable this reviewable land capable of seconomic use to be freed from the management constraints (direct and indirect) resulting from its tenure under reviewable instrument. Much of this lower area has already been developed by oversowing and topdressing and the balance is not only stable and well vegetated, but would also sastain oversowing development.
